Weight	120-200 g/m ² (3.5-5.9 oz/yd ²)
Composition	100% polyester (PES); combed/ring yarn by quality, recycled (rPET) version available.
Knit type	Single jersey · Single Jersey
Use class	Everyday
Stretch	Mechanical stretch
Knit	Single-feed, single-bed circular knit; a flat face and a loop-back reverse.
Hand	Light, fine and fluid; smooth face, lightly textured back; soft, low stretch.
Typical use	T-shirts · innerwear · jerseys
Strength	The economical single-face base — light, fast-drying and the best surface for sublimation.
Watch for	Single-face edges curl; opacity is weak at low weights.

Typical technical ranges

Weight tolerance	±5% (typical); on light/fine jersey (≤ 150 g/m ²) practically ±5-7%
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Width	Open width 150-200 cm; tubular 70-110 cm (varies with machine diameter/inches and gsm)
Shrinkage (wash)	After-wash length/width -3% ... -7% (typical after heat-set; length usually higher); higher if not set / high-twist yarn
Color fastness	Wash 4-5; rubbing dry 4-5, wet 3-4; light 4-6 (lower bound on deep/bright and pale shades); perspiration (acid/alkaline) typically 4-5
Abrasion / pilling	Martindale ~20,000-40,000 cycles (smooth jersey, end-use dependent); pilling 3-4. Brushed/raised variants (fleece) more prone
Gauge / yarn	Machine gauge ~E20-E28 (fine sport jersey E28-E32); yarn typically 75-150 den PES filament (DTY), 50-75 den on fine gauge, heavy jersey 150-300 den
